2015 AGM Resolutions

RESOLUTION #1

WHEREAS landowners provide the habitat and bear the cost of wildlife; and

WHEREAS the mismanagement of wildlife is becoming a problem for landowners that is reaching critical levels, and;

WHEREAS the current compensation programs for wildlife damage are limited, restrictive and largely ineffective; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the WSGA lobby the Government of Alberta to provide better compensation for wildlife damage and develop a hunting season to better control wildlife numbers and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the WSGA lobby the Government of Alberta to also develop a marketplace for wildlife presence and habitat.

RESOLUTION #2

BE IT RESOLVED THAT WSGA develops an invoicing program to assist producers in documenting a claim for reimbursement of expenses of caring for the provinces wildlife.

RESOLUTION #3

WHEREAS the Ministry of Environment, Sustainable Resource Development and Parks has undergone many changes and additions over the last few years, and;

WHEREAS the primary use of public land in the White zone is for agriculture;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the WSGA lobby the Government of Alberta to move the management of grazing lease land into the Agriculture and Rural Development

2015 Resolutions continued

RESOLUTION #4

WHEREAS Property Rights are stated to be of paramount importance to the Premier of Alberta; and

WHEREAS the proposed Springbank dry dam is the first of its kind in Alberta and untested in any comparable circumstance with a rapid mountain river with its alpine silt; and

WHEREAS the Elbow River runs through 30 plus miles of Alberta Public Lands, upstream of Bragg Creek and Redwood Meadows, areas seriously affected by the 2013 flood, yet the diversion system and subsequent dry reservoir construction is planned to occur immediately after the river enters private property, downstream of Bragg Creek and Redwood Meadows; and

WHEREAS the McLean Creek dam-site upstream and other upstream locations on the Elbow River of these two communities are deemed less desirable mostly due to

- a) Time to get approvals and permits to build the dam from provincially owned ESRD lands take much longer to acquire than to process expropriation of lands from private owners (Bill 36)
- b) A policy now in Alberta to never dam another river in the Province
- c) Construction site is much more unstable (mountain rock) than an earthen dam in Springbank; and

WHEREAS the proposed project is budgeted to cost approximately \$215,000,000 and

WHEREAS the public opinion has been massaged in favor of the project with the excuse that time is urgent, and the desire to not disrupt public lands takes precedent over the displacement of rural property owners and the future of their community and families;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that WSGA takes a position to challenge the Alberta government on the need for more public awareness, more in-depth study of the possible negative outcomes, the violation of the fundamental principles of property rights within the province with such a project , and the true search for more alternatives such as have been suggested. These views must be promoted on behalf of all rural landowners in Alberta in order that abrupt onslaughts of the powers of Alberta's central government over the rights of rural property holders without due consultation and agreement be recognized and discouraged.

Canadian cow-calf smartphone app development survey

The Canadian Hereford, Simmental and Angus Associations have jointly been awarded funding from the Alberta Livestock and Meat Agency (ALMA) to explore the development of a mobile smartphone application ("app") for Canadian cow-calf producers with integration into Canadian breed association performance data. Integrated Traceability Solutions Global ("ITS Global") of Okotoks, AB has been contracted to research and summarize the functionalities Canadian cattle breeders desire in a mobile app. This on-line survey is the first step of the process.

The questionnaire will take ten to fifteen minutes to complete. Survey results will be analyzed collectively by ITS Global, and all individual responses will remain confidential. Only those respondents who express an interest in follow-up will be contacted by ITS Global for further feedback, using only the contact information provided in this survey. <u>https://www.surveymonkey.com/s/52XYK3GÂ</u>
